

GREENSAFE ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

ENGLISH

Assembly Instructions GreenSafe – Medium “M” & Large “L”

For use in winter for pot plants

Unfold the GreenSafe ground sheet and lay it out, so that the Velcro opening is visible. Undo the Velcro fastenings.

Place the foam isolation mats in the ground sheet and make sure they are lying flat. Place the filled ground sheet in the desired position on the terrace, on the balcony or in the garden. Now you can place the plants that you would like to protect on the ground sheet. If you use a wheel barrow, be careful not to damage the isolation mats! It's not a problem if the plants are touching each other. Spread out the transparent upper half of the GreenSafe, and close all the air valves, leaving the uppermost valve open. Insert the hose of the electric pump in the open valve and inflate the GreenSafe. The order in which the individual chambers are inflated is irrelevant. The GreenSafe will erect itself as the chambers are filled with air. After inflating each chamber, be sure to close the air valves. Once the GreenSafe is erected, it may be necessary to add air to one or two of the chambers. The zip which connects the upper part to the ground sheet is located on the bottom of the upper part. Carefully lift the upper part of the GreenSafe and place it over the ground sheet so that the beginnings and ends of the zip match up. Connect the two halves by closing the zip completely.

Close the GreenSafe by zipping both sides of the opening together.

On sunny days that reach a temperature of over +15°C, unzip the openings and air vents to help the air circulation inside the GreenSafe. Water the plants when necessary. If the temperature drops below +10°C, it is not a problem to leave the openings closed for a longer period of time. So long as the GreenSafe is closed, it is only necessary to water the plants every 2-3 weeks.

In order to dismantle the GreenSafe with ease, you can use the electric air pump to vacuum the air out of the separate chambers.

Safety Instructions

- : The GreenSafe is not a toy and is not for use as a children's play house.
- : The GreenSafe must be kept at least 5m away from any open fire.
- : Do not place any cactuses or prickly plants in the GreenSafe without covering them first.
- : Make sure that no hard or sharp parts of the plants are touching the outside walls of the GreenSafe.
- : Make sure that sun sensitive plants are not placed in direct sunlight.
- : Snow of more than 15cm should be brushed off.
- : If you fill the GreenSafe with less than 50kg of pot plants, the stability during strong winds or storms cannot be guaranteed.
- : Do not leave people or animals in the GreenSafe with the doors closed – Danger of suffocation!
- : If you are using a Frost Guard then be aware of how to position it and do not use any other heater without first consulting the manufacturer.

Assembly Instructions GreenSafe – Medium “M” & Large “L”

For use outside of winter as a hot bed green house or as a shelter for plants.

Spread out the transparent upper half of the GreenSafe, and close all the air valves, leaving the uppermost valve open. There are 2 loops on the underside of every corner of the GreenSafe. Fasten the loops to the ground using the pegs supplied. The loops should be taught. This will secure the GreenSafe in light winds. For strong winds and storms the GreenSafe will have to be taken down or secured with extra ropes. On sunny days when the temperature reaches +15°C, unzip the openings and air vents to help the air circulation inside the GreenSafe. Water the plants when necessary.

In order to dismantle the GreenSafe with ease, you can use the electric air pump to vacuum the air out of the separate chambers.

Assembly Instructions GreenSafe – X-large “XL” and “XXL”

For use in winter for pot plants

Unfold the GreenSafe ground sheet and lay it out, so that the Velcro opening is visible. Undo the Velcro fastenings.

Place the foam isolation mats in the ground sheet and make sure they are lying flat. Place the filled ground sheet in the desired position on the terrace, on the balcony or in the garden. Make sure there is a power outlet nearby so that you can supply the frost alerter with power should you need it. Now you can place the plants that you would like to protect on the ground sheet. If you use a wheel barrow, be careful not to damage the isolation mats! It's not a problem if the plants are touching each other. If you are using a frost alerter, place it as near to the middle of the ground sheet as possible, but 20cm away from the nearest plants. Run the power cable along the ground sheet so that it coincides with point where the zip, which connects the ground sheet to the upper half of the GreenSafe, comes together.

Spread out the two separate, transparent upper parts (with doors and the roof) of the GreenSafe. Close all the air valves, leaving the uppermost valve open. Insert the hose of the electric pump in the open valve and inflate the GreenSafe. The order in which the individual chambers are inflated is irrelevant. The GreenSafe will erect itself as the chambers are filled with air. After inflating each chamber, be sure to close the air valves. Once the GreenSafe is erected, it may be necessary to add air to one or two of the chambers.

On the underside of the middle part with the doors (square, open at the top and bottom), you will find the zip which connects to the ground sheet. Place the middle part next to the ground sheet so that the beginnings and ends of the zip match up. Carefully lift the middle part of the GreenSafe and place it over the ground sheet. Connect the two parts by closing the zip completely.

To attach the roof to the middle part, simply repeat the same process as used to attach the ground sheet to the middle part.

Plug the frost alerter into the power outlet and turn it on. Set the thermostat of the frost alerter to the lowest possible setting. That way the GreenSafe will maintain a temperature of around 5 to 8°C.

Close the GreenSafe by zipping both sides of the opening together.

On sunny days when the temperature reaches +15°C, unzip the openings and air vents to help the air circulation inside the GreenSafe. Water the plants when necessary.

Safety Instructions

: Be careful not to get any water on the frost alerter when watering your plants. : If you place the GreenSafe directly over grass, the covered grass area will wilt. : The GreenSafe is not a toy and is not for use as a children's play house. : The GreenSafe must be kept at least 5m away from any open fire. : Do not place any cactuses or prickly plants in the GreenSafe without covering them first. : Make sure that no hard or sharp parts of the plants are touching the outside walls of the GreenSafe. : Make sure that sun sensitive plants are not placed in direct sunlight. : Snow of more than 15cm should be brushed off with the GreenSafe broom. : Do not fill the GreenSafe with less than 50kg of pot plants, otherwise the stability during strong winds or storms cannot be guaranteed. : Do not leave people or animals in the GreenSafe with closed doors – Danger of suffocation! : If you are not using the original GreenSafe frost alerter, only use a frost alerter that is suitable for moisture prone areas!

Assembly Instructions GreenSafe – X-large & XXL

For use outside of winter as a hot bed, green house or as a shelter for plants.

Spread out the two separate, transparent upper parts (with doors and the roof) of the GreenSafe. Close all the air valves, leaving the uppermost valve open. On the upper side of the middle part with the doors (square, open at the top and bottom), you will find the zip which connects to the roof. There are 2 loops on the underside of every corner of the GreenSafe. Fasten the loops to the ground using the pegs supplied. The loops should be taught. This will secure the GreenSafe in light winds. For strong winds and storms the GreenSafe will have to be taken down or secured with extra ropes.

On sunny days when the temperature reaches +15°C, unzip the openings and air vents to help the air circulation inside the GreenSafe. Water the plants when necessary.
